| 3. The producer shall ensure that the product is tested for conformity with its formulation, and the source or identity of its raw materials, at such intervals and by such persons, as may be determined by the Authorities. The results of such testing shall be sent to DWI. |
| 4. The use of either the Drinking Water Inspectorate or Defra logos, in respect of any approved product (including on the product or in editorial or advertising/trade copy) is not permitted. |
| 5. The following changes to any product specific condition(s) apply – <i>(i) after disinfection the product is flushed to waste for its entire length before being brought into service; (ii) when in use the main is kept continually in flow; (iii) the product is primarily intended for emergency use and is approved for limited use only and may not be permanently installed in, or used in conjunction with any system for treating or distributing public water supplies. The proposed use must not extend beyond a 90 day period of use on any one occasion.</i> |
